We will also have some veg plants available and will be selling more of our Pure Natural Wild Flower Seed Packs

The entrance is on Felpham Way, just north of the Butlin's roundabout, opposite the University car park. NOT the allotments by the traffic lights. It's an easy walk but also plenty of parking space.
